Reception


Reception classes have been out and about in the community this last few weeks.

Cheshire East Catering currently supply our school meals. They have advised us that the cost of a school meal will be increasing to £2.80 from January.

Uniform

Makeup and hair dye is not permitted and any long hair must be tied up.

We continue to receive complaints about parking outside of school at drop off and pickup. These are regularly reported to the PCSOs and CCSOs. Please do not park on double yellow lines or block our neighbour's driveways.
