Reception



Reception have been enjoying the spring days and we have been playing outside in the sunshine.

We had warm bubbly water out in the water tray. The children really enjoyed exploring with jugs, spoons, sieves and measuring cylinders.

Year 1

The children enjoyed this term's topic Monarchy Mayhem. They thoroughly enjoyed their trip to Staircase House where they travelled back to 1666 and explored what happened on that day when the Great Fire of London started. They got the opportunity to dress up as different characters and ask lots of questions.



In Year 1 we also been busy in Art where we explored ink printing. The children were introduced to several printing artists where they explored their work and had a go at creating a printing piece of artwork themselves. In DT they also learnt about influential architects before they planned and created their own Tudor house.



We hope they have a well-deserved Easter break and we look forward to seeing them back in the Summer Term.

Year 2

Year 2 have worked extremely hard this half term, it has been very short but very exciting! In Art we

finished our final pieces inspired by the artist Nicholas Kowalski, we focused on shape, pattern and colour mixing. The children all thought of a title for their art work too!





In English we have spent time focusing on the features of non-

fiction texts and we gathered facts to create our own Meerkat factsheet, which included subheadings, a glossary, pictures, diagrams and labels.

Finally we finished the half term with an incredible trip to Chester Zoo, the children had such a brilliant time and were a credit to the school. We saw the new giraffe calf, elephants and lions, however the highlight for everyone including the adults was seeing the two jaguars up close- Wow!



Year 3

This half term the children have continued to be enthusiastic about our theme 'Chariots of Fire'! In English we have written some fantastic diaries based on 'Iliona's Roman Diary' a text we have read in our Guided Reading sessions.



In our PE sessions we have loved creating different gymnastic sequences focusing on our 'points and patches'.



In Art and Design, we have created some amazing mosaics pieces based on our focus artist 'Antoni Gaudi'. We look forward to welcoming you back in the Summer Term ready to introduce our new theme 'To Infinity and Beyond'!



Year 4

Year 4 had a brilliant visit to the Whitworth Art Gallery in Manchester. The children took part in a print making workshop where they created images around the theme of displacement. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring the museum to make sketches of anything that caught their imagination and produced some breathtaking pieces of art!



Year 5

This half term, Year Five have undertaken their Geography fieldwork. As part of our work in the Alps, we were looking at comparing a location in the Alps with our own locality. In order to do this the children went out in Poynton and interviewed members of the public to find out about the leisure facilities in our local area and what the public thinks needs to be done to improve them. The children were fantastic and spoke politely to everyone they met and gathered lots of information for us to look at back in the



classroom. Thank you to the parent helpers who joined us and made this visit possible.

Year 6 enjoyed a fabulous Maya Day with Vanessa (PukuB); an inspirational archaeologist who unearths the World's hidden mysteries. They dissected and made comparisons between Viking, Maya and modern day poo; examined pot sherds and identified which vessel they may have belonged to, dressed as people from different hierarchies in the Maya World; traded; made tortilla using traditional methods and listened to a presentation about Vanessa's adventures in the Maya World. An absolutely brilliant day with a lot learned.
