Reception

Reception had their own visitors when Mrs Yarwood kindly came in to show the children the lambs which have recently been born on their family's farm.



The children stroked the lambs, learnt about their development during their first few weeks and asked their own thoughtful questions.

Year 1

This term, we have embraced our theme 'Oh we do like to be beside the seaside'. We enjoyed writing instructions to make a mustard sandwich after reading 'The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch' and we have re-told the story of 'The Storm Whale' and studied information texts using labels, captions and lists. We have also enjoyed learning about the life of Grace Darling and her heroic rescue.



This week, we visited the Blue Planet Aquarium and the children had a great time finding all the seacreatures that we have learnt about. In Maths children have been making groups of items and finding a half and a quarter of a shape and a number. We have





studied textile artists then designed our fish weavings for our study book and we are excited to complete them and tie-dye our Tshirts after the holidays. The children have been programming bee-

bots, studying animals and humans where we have been identifying and classifying them into groups. We have enjoyed learning about the United Kingdom and the four countries which make up the U.K.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a wonderful half term. They have enjoyed exploring and learning about the history of people and places in their own locality, linking to our History and our educational visit to Lyme Park. It was fascinating to observe the changes within living memory. The children explored the lives of the Legh family.



In English the children have enjoyed retelling the narrative 'Where the Wild things Are', writing their own setting descriptions and writing the story from another perspective. All children have worked extremely hard on their handwriting and presentation, as well as developing their use of interesting vocabulary.



In computing the children have been investigating coding using the Bee-Bots to create an algorithm for the robot to then perform, this linked in beautifully with our maths learning of position and direction. We have been working hard to remember left and right as well as clockwise and anticlockwise turns.



Year 3

This half term Year 3 visited Jodrell Bank on their school visit. We learnt all about the life of Bernard Lovell and how he invented the Lovell telescope. We experienced the amazing 'Dome Show' led by an expert astrologer and we also had time to

explore the different exhibitions and came away with an abundance of Space knowledge!





Ben from The Cheshire Cricket Board visited Year 3 and they enjoyed a fantastic cricket session in the sun. They focused on improving their catching skills, had a go at bowling and batting, and worked together as a team when playing matches.



Year 4

This half term year 4 jumped into our summer theme of "Savage Settlers" by inviting a Viking to school! The children had a brilliant day immersed

in all things Norse! Our visitor spoke to the



children about daily Viking life before showing children artefacts that they were able to handle and inspect closely. Children then had the opportunity to use traditional techniques to create their own small clay cup and clay counter based game.

Year 5

On Tuesday 7th May, 18 Year Five pupils visited Wilmslow High School for a Frisbee festival. The morning started with lots of drills to develop and enhance their skills with a frisbee. In their teams, the children then had to play a range of matches following some simple rules of the game. The teamwork shown by all the children was incredible. They all encouraged each other and made sure that everyone was included within the games. The children had a wonderful morning and left with smiles all round. Thank you to the parents who transported them to and from the event.



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Hannah is very passionate about Climate Change and wanted to share her knowledge with the children in Vernon Primary School. She wrote a letter and spoke to Mrs Carvell about leading an assembly for KS2. With help from her friends, Hannah shared the PowerPoint she had

created and answered many questions that the children asked. She was incredibly confident and knowledgeable throughout and her passion shone through. The children were enthused to make changes to help create a better world. Well done Hannah.

We are so proud of how the children approached the SATs and how enthusiastic and mature they were. Safeguarding & Wellbeing

We have recently been delighted to welcome some exciting visitors in to school. Our Foundation Stage children thoroughly enjoyed meeting visitors from the RNLI (Royal National Lifeboat Institution) whilst learning about the extremely important area of water safety. The children were excited and keen to hear some key information and interesting stories.

Our Year Six children were lucky enough to attend a local workshop led by the 'Crucial Crew' (a multiagency event) focusing on staying safe in the community. The session was both highly informative and engaging. All pupils spoke positively about the experience. Sophie and Jess, year six pupils both agreed that 'it made safety fun'.

Some classes have also taken part in the NSPCC 'Speak Out Stay Safe' campaign. This was an engaging online session about staying safe, with a particular focus on what to do if children feel worried. The feedback from the children has been very positive.

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We have continued to hold assemblies this term, with a focus on safeguarding, where key messages have been delivered to all children. Our safeguarding committee of pupils have also been keen to take part in the assemblies, planning and delivering important safeguarding messages to all.

Eco Council



The Eco-councilors met recently with Sharon Duke from Poynton Town Council to talk about being Poynton Pollinators. The children discussed what they could do to help the local environment, such as growing flowers, keeping areas of grass long and leaving dishes of stones and water out for the bees to drink from. After half term we will be creating our own Bugingham Palace for the side of the Civic hall.
