### Reception



In Reception we have been celebrating the Chinese New Year. We have learnt all about the animals that represent the different years, we have made Chinese lanterns and had a go at writing the numbers in Chinese. The children have loved the colours and music involved in this celebration. During PE we made a dance with our dragon's head that we decorated. Many of our families have even been to Manchester to watch the parade; they then shared photos with us all.





This term, Year 1 have been busy exploring The Great Fire of London. We have been learning all about how the fire started, why it spread so quickly, and how London changed as a result. Our visit to Staircase House was a fantastic way to bring our learning to life, helping us to imagine what life was like in 1666. The children got the opportunity to dress up and take part in role play activities which they thoroughly enjoyed.

In Maths, the children have been working hard on place value to 20 as well as addition and subtractions. The children have been using different resources and strategies to help them solve problems and develop their number knowledge.

In DT, we have been busy planning our very own London buses! We explored how buses have developed and changed over time and the children are excited to design and start building their buses after the half term break.

The children have made an incredible start to the Spring term, embracing their learning with enthusiasm and creativity! In English, they've loved diving into the narrative *The Lion Inside* and have produced some fantastic descriptive stories. They've also enjoyed exploring *Little Red and the Very Hungry Lion* and will soon be writing narrative diaries and letters inspired by well-known tales.

In History, our budding historians have been piecing together the key events in Nelson Mandela's life, exploring the big question: *Was it fair to send Nelson Mandela to prison?* This enquiry has sparked some thoughtful discussions and deeper understanding.

In Science, the children have been investigating the best growing conditions for seeds and bulbs. They've even explored the pros and cons of hydroponic growing—a fascinating way to observe how plants thrive without soil!

This half term, the children have immersed themselves in our theme 'Chariots of Fire'! They have all approached the Spring term with fantastic levels of enthusiasm and commitment to their learning. In English, the children have been busy writing their historical narratives based on 'Escape from Pompeii'. The children found learning about the eruption of 'Mount Vesuvius' and the city of 'Pompeii' fascinating. They have thoroughly enjoyed creating Roman characters and settings which include vivid descriptions to reflect this period of time.

In Art & Design, the children have been exploring the work of 'Antoni Gaudi'. They have commented and explored in detail some of his most famous artwork such as his 'Rainbow Mosaic Chimney' in Barcelona. The children then used our school building to create their very own mosaic artwork using small pieces of coloured card.

In PE, the children have been learning to play hockey! They have developed their skills of holding a hockey stick, passing the ball to an opponent and tackling safely - they have shown great sportsmanship and competitiveness!

Year 4 have had a brilliant start to the Spring Term under the exciting new theme "Born to be Wild!" Last week, the children embarked on a memorable residential trip to the Tattenhall Centre, where they participated in an engaging drama session that addressed the serious issue of deforestation. During this session, the students created short sketches that explored the threats to the rainforest and discussed practical actions we can take to protect our natural world.

They also enjoyed an art session inspired by Henri Rousseau, during which they crafted imaginative wire art rainforest foliage and designed relief prints based on their own leaf sketches. The centre staff were particularly impressed by the children's exemplary behavior and enthusiasm, setting a wonderful tone for the rest of the term and representing Vernon fantastically.











What a fabulous start to the Spring Term we have had, diving into our exciting theme 'Inspiring Inventors'. The children have loved our recent visit to Styal Mill as we learnt about the lives of young children during the Industrial Revolution. Whilst visiting the Apprentice house and the Mill, the children tried out first hand the many chores and jobs the orphans would have completed during the 1800's.

Another highlight of the half term has been our Computing 'Filming' unit. The children have thoroughly enjoyed exploring camera angles using the Chrome books and worked diligently in their groups to plan out and carefully record their videos. It was such a pleasure to see them draying on taught techniques as they taught us new skills. These ranged from hair tutorials to juggling.
